Squaw Valley Mountain Resort in Olympic Valley, California, is one of the largest ski areas in the United States, and was the host site of the entire 1960 Winter Olympics. It is the second-largest ski area in Lake Tahoe after Heavenly, with 30 chairlifts, 3,600 acres and the only funitel (aerial tramway) in the U.S. Since Squaw Valley joined forces with Alpine Meadows in 2012, the resorts offer joint access to 6,200 acres, 43 lifts and over 270 trails. The resort attracts approximately 600,000 skiers a year. Note, Squaw is 37 miles from South Lake Tahoe.

Adult Registration:

Registrants are required to be a member of an NBS club (preferably Steel on Ice) and to purchase at least three days of lift tickets. Registration can be purchased online at <https://tinyurl.com/yaq86lzm> **through 1/31/18**. Only 50 Mid-Week registrations will be sold and only a few remain available. Onsite lift tickets will be **very** limited.

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Squaw Valley Resort 101 – Fast Facts

#DYK – More than 700 inches of snow fell at Squaw Valley-Alpine Meadows during the 2016-17 season? Based on the historic snowfall, the resort will operate July 1-4 and Saturdays thereafter as conditions permit. Wow!

Rankings. Squaw Valley| Alpine Meadows Resort was voted Voted 2016 'Best Ski Resort' in North America by USA Today and 10 Best Readers' Choice. In 2017, the Resort received *Ski's* Golden Eagle Award for Environmental Excellence.

Location. Located off Highway 89, between Truckee and Tahoe City, on the North Shore of Lake Tahoe, Squaw Valley is just 42 miles from Reno, 96 miles from Sacramento and 196 miles from San Francisco via all-weather Interstate 80.

Elevations. Base Elevation is 6,200 feet and Peak Elevation: 9,050 feet. The resorts six "main" mountain peaks are Snow King (7,552'), Broken Arrow (8,030'), KT-22 (8,070'), Emigrant (8,774'), Squaw Peak (8,885') and Granite Chief (9,006').

Snow. Average annual snowfall is 450 inches, however 2016-17 was an exceptional year with 714 inches! Our fingers are crossed for another exceptional year in 2017-18. In addition, the resort has snowmaking at 11 out of 29 lifts.

Monthly Snowfall Average for March. 91 inches.

Total Mountain Acreage. The resort has 3600 Skiable Acres, including 170+ trails and 16 Bowls.

Trail Classification. 25% Beginner, 45% Intermediate and 30% Advanced.

Lift System. 29 Total Lifts including Aerial Tram: 1 (110-person tram), 1 Funitel (28-person gondola), 4 Express 6-pacs, 3 Express Quads, 1 Fixed-Grip Quad, 9 Triple Chairs, 5 Double Chairs, 3 Surface Lifts and 2 Magic Carpets. Total lift capacity is 53,500 people per hour.

Terrain Parks. Belmont Park, Gold Coast Park, Mainline Park, SnoVentures Start Park and High Camp Start Park.

March Climate (average daytime highs and night time lows in Fahrenheit). Mar: 44 high, 21 low.
