We are working on plans for the upcoming youth ski season. Since our fundraiser, the Golf Outing, was not held this year, youth

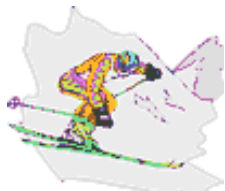

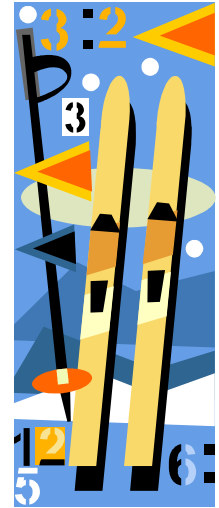


## Bowling

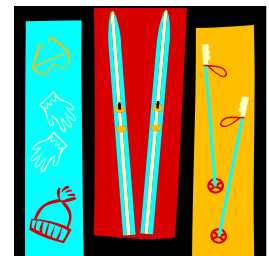
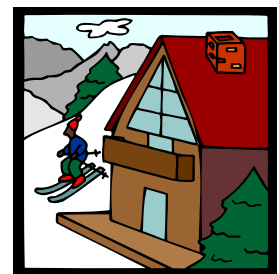


## Holiday Party at Rivers Casino

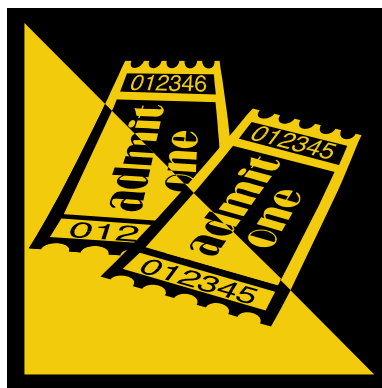
- **GuyTorry**, Improv, **1/3-6**.

**Adult Membership (April-March): \$45.00**  
*Consecutive Prompt Adult Renewal (April-June): \$35.00*  
**Family Membership (April-March): \$95.00**  
*Consecutive Prompt Family Renewal (April-June): \$75.00*  
**Associate Membership (April-March): \$35.00**  
*Consecutive Prompt Associate Renewal (April-June): \$25.00*  
**Associate Family Membership (April-March): \$75.00**  
*Consecutive Prompt Associate Family Renewal (April-June): \$55.00*  
**Youth Membership (April-September): \$10.00**  
*Late Youth Membership (October-March): \$20.00*  
 Members outside the continental USA: +\$10.00

Annual dues run from April through March.

Consecutive: Member who paid dues during the previous year. This year only, anyone who has ever paid dues before can pay at the consecutive renewal rate until the end of June.
